

NATIONAL AWARD FOR SERVICE TO NURSING / MIDWIFERY 2024

This award is designed to enable the profession to recognise nurses or midwives at a national level.

CRITERIA

The nominee must be a current NZNO member:

(a) Whose actions have embraced te Tiriti o Waitangi principles

AND

(b) Made a difference to nursing or midwifery practice (includes practice, education, research etc) and/or a difference to the practice environment of nurses or midwives

AND

- (a) Whose actions have embraced and illustrated NZNO Maranga Mai goals:
 - 1. Ensure te Tiriti is actualised within and across the health system.
 - 2. Fix the number of trained and qualified nurses across the health system.
 - 3. Fix pay and conditions that are equal across the health system and meet nurses' values and expectations.
 - 4. Fix the number of people in nursing training to meet current and future needs.
 - 5. Fix the number of Maori and Pasifica nurses to meet the need.

PRESENTATION

National Certificate of Service to Nursing / Midwifery.

PROCESS

1. National Committee

The National Committee should consist of

- (a) Four members of the Board of Directors including a member from Te Poari o Te Rūnanga o Aotearoa and may include the President or Vice President
- (b) Quorum three members
- (c) Terms of office, two years with right of renewal for two years.

2. Duties of the Committee

- (a) To advertise, promote award.
- (b) To distribute appropriate nomination forms (see Appendix One) as necessary.
- (c) Meet to consider nominations and maintenance of committee (minimum twice a year). Can be done by teleconference.
- (d) Recommend successful nominations to Board of Directors.
- (e) Organise the presentation of the awards, in conjunction with Board of Directors, eg:
 - (i) national NZNO Conference
 - (ii) regular Regional Council meeting
 - (iii) other suitable occasion (eg seminar)
- (f) Any other business as is necessary to ensure continued functioning of committee.

3. Nominations

- (a) Prospective recipients can be nominated and seconded by one of the following and must provide evidence that the committee for that group is in support of the nomination:
 - Regional Councils
 - National committees of Colleges / Sections
 - National Student Unit
 - Te Poari o Te Rūnanga o Aotearoa
- (b) The nominator submits
 - biographical synopsis
 - description of contribution
- (c) Process for nominating members for awards:
 - (i) Nominations are made on the approved form, preferably typed rather than handwritten (see attached Appendix One).
 - (ii) Nominations close **Sunday**, **14 July 2024 at 5.00pm**.
 - (iii) Nominations are to be forwarded to Returning Officer, NZNO, PO Box 2128, Wellington or email to <u>awards@nzno.org.nz</u> who then passes applications to the Awards Committee
 - (iv) A person can be nominated more than once and by more than one group.
 - (v) Approval of person being nominated does not have to be sought by nominator.
 - (vi) Board of Directors decides annually on awards.

Note: The decision of the Awards Committee is final; no correspondence is to be entered in to.
