Membership Committee (Debra Isaac)

The membership focus for the year ahead is 'Students'. We have 2 student reps on the MC, Maddie Anthony, and Rebecca Dunn. Presently we have about 3700 students registered with NZNO. Our focus is to get into the nursing schools, to get in touch with students, and help them throughout their nursing studies, ensure they are represented well. It's in the early stages, as MC is the link to the BOD, and MC is the link to the students/members via the BOD.

MC have yet to meet with the BOD, and in cooperate our work together, with Maranga Mai. There has been some thought on what the purpose of the MC is, does NZNO need a MC. We are hoping to get answers soon, at the meeting to be held on the 9/05/2023.

<u>April 15 Rally:</u> Marched up Queen Street, ending up at the Domain. The turn out was less that expected given the numbers who said prior that they would be attending. There were a couple of technical issues, but they were easily overcome.

Will do a survey to get some feedback: for those who attended, what got you there, those who didn't but said they would, what was the barrier and what can we improve on.

The purpose of the rally was to launch the petition.

Feedback from this group:

- Couldn't get people to go.
- Saturdays are very precious, better to choose a weekday.
- Do we think NZNO has lost a bit of face with members, hence the apathy around attendance?
 (This wasn't the feedback from the phone calls made by Organisers).

<u>Election Campaign</u>: Important to hold politicians to account for Health and the 5 fixes of Maranga Mai. (Karene shared that health was number 5 in the priorities for the public and is now number 2.)

We need to build and maintain momentum. Visiting all MPs across the country in July and we need members to come with us.

<u>Petition:</u> Currently at around 15,000 signatures and we are aiming for 50,000.

<u>Te Whatu Ora stop work meetings</u>: These are coming up 29-31 May. Time paid for members who are on shift and attending the stop work meetings.
