Proposed Amendments to Guidelines on Surrogacy Arrangements involving Providers of Fertility Services and Guidelines on Donation of Eggs or Sperm between Certain Family Members

The New Zealand Nurses Organisation welcomes the opportunity to comment on the above consultation document.

NZNO supports the proposed changes to the *Guidelines on Surrogacy Arrangements* which align surrogacy with other human rights legislation by removing unjustified discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation and gender. The amended guidelines are consistent with NZNO's Code of Ethics which acknowledges that cultural safety is integral to nursing practice and that culture encompasses class, sexual orientation, religion, age and gender. We congratulate the Committee on providing an ethical framework for guiding surrogacy arrangements which respects the rights of individual people and groups, and that recognises the unique contextual determinants of ethical decisions concerning surrogacy arrangements, which include cultural, family whānau, professional, religious and personal beliefs.
