



## Nursing Research Section (NRS) Te Wāhanga Rangahau Tapuhi Grant Guidelines

- 1. Thank you for your interest in applying for a NRS, Te Wāhanga Rangahau Tapuhi Grant, (herein referred to as the NRS). Please read the following guidelines before applying:
- 2. You must be a current member of the NRS, NZNO to be eligible.
- 3. Grants may be made to assist members of the NRS to attend/ participate in events related to nursing research that will further their knowledge base of the field they are working:

workshops

seminars

o conferences or symposiums

o post-graduate study, and

study days

publication, etc.

- 4. Applications must be submitted on the <u>NRS Grant Application Form</u>. These forms are available through the <u>NZNO Scholarships & Grants</u> page, and should be forwarded to <u>research@nzno.org.nz</u>
- 5. Applications will be considered at the committee meeting following these dates:
  - i. Application close date #1 31 March 2026, and
  - ii. Application close date #2 30 September 2026.
- 6. Grants made will be subject to the availability of funds.
- 7. Grants up to a total of \$500 may be awarded per application round.
- 8. It is expected that NRS is acknowledged in some form of output resulting from the grant.
- 9. Written reports
  - iii. There is an expectation that the knowledge gained should be shared.
  - iv. A report (approx. 500 words) is required within six working weeks of completing the research activity for publication in places such as NRS website.
  - v. Your report should outline how the grant helped towards professional development, practice improvement/s from the recommendations of your research, and/ or changes to nursing practice.
  - vi. Please ensure the report is sent in a Word document to the NRS by email.
  - vii. In absence of a report being filed, the section request that the grant money be returned.
- 10. Grant money must be used within six months of being awarded.
- 11. In deciding the amount granted, NRS Committee will take into consideration the total amount requested, and contributions from the employer or other funders.

Individuals may receive a maximum of one grant every two-years. For example, if awarded a grant in February 2024, the next application considered for that individual will be from February 2026.
