Sad news

We heard this week of the passing of Kaye Hay, who many of you will have had the pleasure of sharing time with. Some recollections from Dr John Wyeth-

Kaye was the original gastro nurse at Wellington Hospital when gastroscopies were performed in a converted room on the ward. In the early 1980's she initiated the first meeting of gastro nurses as part of the NZSG doctors meeting in Wellington.

This she did with the support of Eru Pomare, himself an acclaimed leader in gastroenterology. She remembers with pride that she did the catering for morning teas at the meeting by baking scones.

As you know the Gastro Nurses went from strength to strength from that small beginning. Kaye took pride in how many doctors she "trained" do endoscopy, which always had an emphasis on respect for the patient and staff, and treating everyone equally. Kaye did not tolerate pomposity and would always be forthright in her opinions, which were usually correct.

Kaye actively encouraged and participated in research. She went to the Pacific islands with Eru Pomare to investigate fibre intake and nutrition in isolated communities, which involved living on the remote island.

She has fond memories of how diets were so different to the Western diets with the plentiful fruit eaten every day.

Another aspect of the study involved collecting faeces and sifting it to measure fibre content. There were lots of research studies performed, including having naso-enteral tubes inserted to collect bile from herself, swallowing radio-capsules measuring colon pH and staying 24 hours in the hospital having breath hydrogen and blood short chain fatty acid levels measured, and then working the same day. Whilst Charge Nurse of gastro, there



were a number of nurses she mentored who themselves became significant leaders in the profession. Kaye also had an international presence and developed links with Australia in particular, attending the GESA / GENSA meetings and getting Australian nurses to participate in the NZ meetings. Kaye was a nurse that got things done, was very supportive of her staff and patients and could always have fun.

We are thinking of Kaye's family at this time, she will be missed.
