- Can build relationships across the union with members and member leaders, their team of organisers and other key staff including Industrial Advisors, media and comms, member support, and Professional Nursing Advisors
- Strong union values
- Strong planning skills and ability to ensure national organising plans are reflected in their local organisers' work plans
- A strong focus on winning
- Experience in union campaigning
- An ability to work with and develop delegates
- Some union education is desirable, especially organiser education
- A good understanding of, and ability to, leverage health and safety into organising
- An ability to travel regularly
