NZ NURSES MEMORIAL FUND

The 100th year of the NZ Nurses Memorial Fund (NZNMF) was celebrated in Dunedin with a special function in July.

The memorial fund was founded in 1917 by the Otago Trained Nurses Association as a practical memorial to the 10 New Zealand nurses who drowned when the SS Marquette was torpedoed in the Aegean Sea in October 1915.

Money was raised throughout the country to establish a benevolent fund to give assistance to nurses who through sickness or old age were unable to pursue their nursing careers. Nurses from all over New Zealand are entitled to request an application form to apply for financial aid.

The fund accepts donations, annual membership is \$10 and life membership is \$100.
