#### **Regional Chair Report**

**Covid 19** has certainly disrupted the last five months impacting on all aspects of our lives. It has been through the efforts of everyone that we have reached our current position with no community transmission detected and new cases limited to new arrivals in quarantine.

Nurses have been at the forefront of testing and treating throughout this period. NZNO is seeking feedback on your experiences during this time to enable it to continue to act and respond on your behalf to ensure processes are in place to ensure safety of your patients, the community, and yourselves. Please feedback via delegate networks, organisers, and your Membership committee representative Valerie Weir-Van Til. Please also respond to other surveys circulating e.g. DHB, University of Otago.

From a regional perspective, events in the Top of the South's Operational plan scheduled during this period have been cancelled including our Regional Convention. It has been very disappointing that this has occurred but as you know completely unavoidable. Regional Council has commenced using Zoom to connect for meetings and we are intending to use this format over the foreseeable future for forums as well as in person when we can safely gather. Utilising both will provide more access for members to attend.

**Remit Discussion Forum** will be held on 6<sup>th</sup> August 6 – 8pm both in person at Nelson NZNO Training Room and via Zoom. The flyer has been sent directly to you via email.

Remits are the change proposals you, as members of NZNO, will be voting on. Voting opens 5<sup>th</sup> August online. Change proposals can alter the Constitution of NZNO or create policy for NZNO.

The forum provides the opportunity to discuss the remit proposals with other members and your Regional Council before you make a decision on how you will vote.

The Remits have been sent to you directly as part of the voting process which includes the election process for President, Vice president, and three Board director positions.

#### MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

This committee is one of the two standing committees of NZNO. It provides a link between the Board and members.

Representatives come from every region of NZNO within New Zealand as well as representatives from Colleges and Sections and the National Student Unit. The President or Vice President attend their meetings.

Representatives provide environmental scans for every committee meeting which are also sent through to the Board with a summary of the committee meeting.

Environmental scans provide opinion from members within the region and describe the status of nursing and NZNO within the region.

The committee establishes a business and operational plan in October every year outlining the work they intend to undertake in the following year.

The workplan may include projects that the Board or the committee itself wishes work to be progressed on. Projects are subject to the approval of the board.

"One member, one vote" for the AGM remit voting process and the structural diagram have been projects undertaken by the membership committee.
