




Annual Report for the Accreditation Programme 2022:

The past year has been challenging with the COVID-19 response, but the accreditation programme has continued as usual with only some minor time delays. I wish to express a huge thank you to the assessors and our moderator who have kept the accreditation process successful.

Accredited Diabetes Nurses:

Overall accreditation numbers have remained stable, with a net loss of two accredited nurses since 2021. Applications each round include new applications, evidencing interest in the accreditation programme. Reminder emails continue to be sent to those nurses due renewal to encourage maintenance applications. Ethnicity data below is included to encourage discussion on ethnic representation within the diabetes nursing workforce. Nil accredited nurses from Northland, Lakes, Tairāwhiti, Taranaki, Wairarapa, Nelson Marlborough, West Coast, South Canterbury, & Southern DHBs; consider how to engage and promote accreditation in these areas moving forward.
