#### **Committee News**

In addition hearing from Ravez Malik, diabetic international guru on neuropathy, the programme will include an update from Professor Jim Mann on what not to eat and Dr Jeremy Krebs will talk about some of the newer diets in people in people with diabetes and low carb and protein ratios in people with T1DM. ## **Nurse Prescribing News**

The addition of vildagliptin to the NZ Formulary last year highlighted that the list which registered nurses prescribe from has become out of date. This takes away some of our ability to increase equity of access to care. We reported last time that Nursing Council (NCNZ) had advised us that work on updating the list would commence early in 2020. This involves a consultation process. We have written to NCNZ asking for an update on start date and the projected time frame and will let you know when we hear back. We understand several other DHB nurse prescribing groups are planning to go through the JERC process in the next round – kia kaha everyone and let us know how you get on.

## **Accreditation News**

Accreditation is a voluntary peer reviewed process where objective assessment is made of your diabetes nursing knowledge and skills against nationally agreed criteria. It is an opportunity for you to reflect on how your practice has developed in the last three years and what makes your work so valuable. See the ACDN NZNO website for details of what is involved and how to apply: ACDN Accreditation. The closing date for the next round is 6 March 2020.

The documents for the new process will be up on the website by the end of the year. After the next round in March 2020 we will be shortening the length of time between opening and closing of the application dates. This is partly because people can find it a long wait if they apply early.

#### October 2019 Accreditation Round

All applications for accreditation were achieved for this round - 2 new, 5 maintenance accreditation, and 1 nurse practitioner application. Two applications are currently being moderated.

The professional development grant mentioned below may be used to cover some costs of accreditation or assessor training.

## **ACDN Professional Development Grant**

Twice a year ACDN makes grants to assist nurses to attend events related to diabetes nursing which will further their knowledge i.e. workshops, conferences, study days, seminars and post graduate study. #### **Research Review**

In September this year Spanakis et al published data in the Journal of Clinical Endocrinology & Metabolism, suggesting an association between glucose levels on the day of discharge from hospital and increased readmissions and mortality. The team evaluated the minimum blood glucose in the last 24 hours of hospitalisation

and 30 day readmission and post discharge mortality rates in people with DM. 843,978 admissions in Veteran Affairs Hospitals over 14 years to 31/12/14 were assessed. Bgls under 5.2 were associated with higher readmission rate within 30 days. Patients who had hypoglycaemia during the last day of their admission also had a higher rate of dying within 180 days after discharge. This adds to the body of evidence encouraging us to try to protect our inpatients from hypoglycaemia.

## New free online therapy tool to improve access to mental health support for New Zealanders

A new free online therapy tool makes effective mental health support more accessible for New Zealanders. Developed by the Wise Group, Just a Thought offers Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT) courses to support people across the country experiencing anxiety and depression. People using the tool can choose to complete courses using the self-care option, or their clinician can prescribe them a course and monitor their progress via secure login to a dedicated clinician dashboard. The Wise Group has committed to making it available for free to all New Zealanders.


