### **Journal Report – AGM 2025**

The Emergency Nurse New Zealand journal continues to serve as a vital platform for showcasing excellence in emergency nursing across Aotearoa. We extend our sincere thanks to Editor Sandy Richardson and Publisher Sean McGarry for their ongoing leadership and dedication. Gratitude is also due to all contributors—both new and returning—whose work enriches the publication.

In 2025, the journal featured regional reports on:

### **Webinars Report – AGM 2025**

The 2025 webinar series covered a broad spectrum of topics, including:
