The current structure of the journal has allowed for the regular features to develop further, with the paediatric pearls, nurse practitioner tips and tricks, mental health focus and Te Ao Maori sections now established. The introduction of a central theme for each edition has made it easier for contributors to identify areas to focus on, with editions looking at Mental Health and Violence and Aggression as the first examples of this. Experts in the areas related to each topic are invited to present Guest Editorials to further stimulate the conversations around the central topic and its significance to emergency nursing. In 2023 the Editor plans to produce three issues around February, June and October.
