



College of Emergency Nurses New Zealand (CENNZ) Grants and Awards 2022 Annual General Meeting

For the third year in a row, we have been impacted with covid restrictions which has resulted in many professional development opportunities being cancelled and the CENNZ conference being deferred.

CENNZ has been able to support some activities with four members receiving education grants for various professional development opportunities at a dollar value between \$400 to \$878. CENNZ has granted three post graduate funding grants at a dollar value of \$1000.00 per member.

The Conference grants continue to be held over till next year's conference in Christchurch, which is eagerly anticipated. There are 17 conference grants from around the country and 5 grants given to Whakatane Emergency Department, which were in recognition of their services during the incredibly challenging time following the Whakaari/White Island disaster.

There are some grants that haven't been called upon this year again and this is essentially due to covid restrictions. These includes the Pacific Island Nurse Grant and the Leadership in Emergency Nursing Grant. The Alfred and Monash University had cancelled this leadership opportunity for the last few years, but we hope there may be a similar course for 2023.

This year has seen the introduction of a He Puawai Tapuhi Maori Grant which we look forward to receiving applications for.

CENNZ supports members within this portfolio and encourages application for the numerous grants available to support advancing practice and ongoing professional development.
