St John attended 450000 111 calls in the last 12 months.

FENZ have co-responded to approximately 2353 Purple Calls in the last 12 months.



Why was the MOU developed.

To ensure that we get the appropriate resources to the patient as quickly as possible.

All FENZ appliances carry LP1000 AEDs and first Response kits.

Faster response by FENZ in some cases due to lower utilization rates than St John resource's.

Only 9% of out of hospital cardiac arrests were defibrillated by a public access defibrillator prior to the first responders arriving.



International Survival Rates 2017

Benefits

FENZ have had ROSC multiple times with early defibrillation prior to ambulance arrival.

High performance CPR delivered by a fit highly trained team rotating every 2 minutes.

Allows ambulance staff to concentrate on airway care and drug therapy.

Safety in numbers for staff at highly emotional scenes.

Building strong inter-service relationships which have shown benefits at other critical incidents.
