

TNCC Instructor Process 2024

To become a TNCC Instructor, you must:

1. Receive an “Instructor Potential” (IP) rating in a 9th edition TNCC Provider class. The Course Director will provide you with an Instructor Potential form verifying your IP status. (If you received IP status in an 8th edition course, you must observe a 9th edition course prior to taking the instructor course – there is no charge for this)
2. Register for an instructor course
3. Pretest to revalidate competency just prior to or at the beginning of the instructor course. Pretesting is only required if your TNCC provider course was completed more than 90 days prior to the instructor course, or if you scored less than 90% on either the skill station test or the online exam.
4. Complete the online Instructor Course modules. You will receive a link to the modules from ENA when you register for the instructor course.
5. Prepare to teach components of the TNCC/ENPC during the instructor course. You will be assigned one each of the following:
 6. A large group activity
 7. A TNP or PNP Skills Station
 8. A TNP or PNP testing station
9. Please allow approximately 8 hours to complete the modules (3-4 hours) and prepare your teaching assignments (3-4 hours)
10. Attend the on-day instructor course and complete the teaching assignments listed above. There is no additional testing on this day.
11. After completing the instructor course, the instructor potential is referred to as an instructor candidate. The instructor candidate must be monitored teaching a provider course within twelve (12) months of the instructor course. Instructor candidates who fail to complete the monitoring process within the 12 months must retake the instructor course.
12. An instructor candidate can be monitored up to three times and is encouraged to use monitoring to gain comfort and expertise in teaching. If the instructor candidate is not deemed ready to teach independently by the monitor after three monitoring attempts, the instructor candidate may retake the instructor course if their provider status is still current.
