#### **Education in Region**

Waikato DHB held their annual study day for enrolled nurses within the Midlands region on 30<sup>th</sup> September 2019. The study day titled 'Celebrating Diversity of Care and Equity' certainly had a great programme including Refugee Health and Challenges, Care of Dying Patient in a Multi-Cultural Society, Caring Beyond the Boarders-an Internationally Qualified Nurse experience, The Challenges of being HIV Positive, Using a Strength Based approach to improve health outcomes for Maori. Certainly a great day of learning and generated lots of discussion.

# **Current Issues In Region**

There is still no clear direction as to whether enrolled nurses can collect patients from theatre, I have had a meeting with Kate Yeo, Deputy Chief Nurse Waikato DHB on August 6<sup>th</sup> to again discuss this ongoing issue. This was also discussed at the DHB Enrolled Nurse study day at which Kate was present. Work has now begun on reviewing the Direction and Delegation of the Enrolled Nurse Procedure to include enrolled nurses collecting a patient following a procedure, a small group of us have had an opportunity of reviewing this prior to the document being sent out for wider consultation.

In the next couple of years we will have some of our Midlands Regional Enrolled Nurse Section committee members retiring so are currently very mindful of our succession planning!!!!

#### News

There continues to be a few new enrolled nurse positions advertised at the DHB including at our rural hospitals. The peer support monthly meetings for new graduate enrolled nurses being employed at the DHB have been set for 2020.

We will watch with great interest to see how the inclusion for a funded orientation programme and the ACE programme for enrolled nurse's progresses.

Speaking up for Safety is a new initiative at Waikato DHB. The programme, which has been developed by the Cognitive Institute and has already been rolled out at other DHBs, supports our people, especially doctors, nurses and allied health clinicians to speak up whenever they are concerned about a patient's safety. 30 staff members at Waikato DHB have become accredited presenters of the Speaking Up for Safety seminars that will be rolled out across the organisation.

The aim is for all 7,500 of WDHB employees to attend one of these one hour seminars over the next 12 to 18 months.

This is an evidence-based framework, developed by the Vanderbilt University Centre for Patient and Professional Advocacy, that has been successfully rolled out in other organisations in the US and Australia and in other DHBs in NZ.

My sincere thanks to our PNA Suzanne Rolls and to the National Enrolled Nurse Section Committee for your ongoing commitment, support and for advocating strongly for enrolled nursing at national and regional levels with key stakeholders.
