Michelle to give feedback copies to Paul.  Plunket:  Paul said that he raised in speech at conference for the 4th coming major pieces of work.  1. Campaign 2024 Te Whatu Ora for the bargaining 2. non-Te Whatu Ora 3. Health and Safety 4. Role of the Nurse  Plunket sits within the non – Te Whatu Ora.  Spoke with the non-Te Whatu Ora groups. Plunket were the first on the move re this. Hospice are also keen for this.  Health Care assistants:  Paul asked for a sample of what the feedback from the EN members regarding HCA's role expanding and name change with the word "nurse". Concerns raised – public safety, knowledge etc.

Michelle made clear the concern if they are unregulated and the HCA does not report back or an error happens these falls back on the RN/EN and risk of practicing certificate.

The EN has fought hard for this to be done by them.

Paul said that it is already happening, Paul has had emails from HCAs of the nursing tasks they have been getting. There are 3 options:

- 1. We do nothing
- 2. Let the employer decide
- 3. NZNO make a clear line

Paul feels it has been let go for too long and having many battles. And need to take control of the HCA and the other issues going on. Agree in high pay but not take jobs away from the nurses. The boundaries need to be reregulated and be complementary to the nurses.

There should be a career pathway to Nursing for the HCA.

Title changes for HCA's, the word "nurse" is a protected title.

Role of the nurse Campaign – is about a nurse. No set EN or RN.

# 4. NCNZ - Cath, Jane, Lauren & Waikura

Update of the committee and where we are at.

National committee are looking to do a webinar next on Scope of Practice and asking NCNZ to be a part of this – there will be a coms plan.

Janes thanked the EN Committee for their support and input into the Scope Review and Competencies.

Have taken under quality insurance, needs to go to the board to be approved. Final Q&A, don't feel they will want to make any changes. This happens on the 29<sup>th</sup> November.

Week before Christmas will go for consult between the RN and EN competences as well as RN Scope and for consultation in February 2024. Wants to ensure that the process goes well.

Won't have ready to go back to council in April 2024.

Consult on the EN and RN education standards, which will be ready for February.

Jane feels that it has been positive and hasn't heard any negative regarding the new EN Scope and education review. Feedback on clear distention and progression to Registered Nursing which needs to be owned by Te Pukenga, however NCNZ will have some input.

Michelle raised the concern raised the HCA issue and wanting to be regulated and name change with word "nurse" in it.

Jane said she that they would support some regulation but not a full regulation.

Waikura found the reference for Treaty of Waitangi and wanting to make it achievable.

Jane mentioned that the scope is a big shift and looking at the future.

Earn as you learn as part of your clinical placement.

Suzanne raised with NCNZ re the Scope and getting the qualifications through the Government, however Jane does not feel this will be an issue. Jane said that there will be no change with the new Government, however needs to follow the legislation.

Standard Seven – only focuses on Covid – 19 it does not cover general natural disasters which needs to be added in.

#### Other:

Simulation hours needs to be looked at and if they can be part of the clinical hours in general including in an event a natural disaster happens. Need to push for the simulation definition.

#### Went through Standards to provide feedback:

Issues for enrolled nursing students

Graduate workforce – transition into practice and the relationships with employers

Key preparation for enrolled nurses who are going to be preceptors

Open ended standards – that is providers can interpret. Rural providers there is no competition

The institutions to have standardisation. Need to have consistent standards to ensure that the students are provided for.

Standard 1 - welcome this

## Standard 2 Public safety

2.4 – include the NZNO code of ethics – important to have the ability to inform decision making – these are the professional nursing ethics statements for nursing in Aotearoa.

- 2.5 Vaccination requirements is part of their health checks to include the entry requirements for clinical requirements for study or employment MMR, Hep B
- 2.16 clinical need to outline the exemption process the NCNZ uses to approve a student to re-engage in the programme if failed twice. Need to find a rationale for the "2" why is this?

#### Standard 3

- 3.5 wording mistake head or lead of nursing
- 3.6 add Enrolled Nurse Section as a stakeholder for the enrolled nursing programmes

#### Standard 4

4.1 - NZQA level 6 is preferred by the enrolled nurse section however a compromise was the level 5 with a transition paper at level 6. - However .........

Enrolled nurse education level – NZQA level 6 will need to be considered if NZNO campaigns for HCA level to be at NZQA 5. Key issues for enrolled nurses is the work undertaken by Te Whatu Ora workforce plans and documents.

Hca – level 5 – implications for enrolled nurses – need to find out the position of NZNO campaign

Hours of clinical – support the hours to be maintained at 900 for Enrolled nurses

We disagree with the nursing council reducing the number of hours for registered nurses and we strongly advocate for the hours to be maintained at 1100.

4.8 - bullet point 1. Simulation

Simulation has its place — need references and statements to underpin the argument to keep simulation in the nursing programmes and these education standards so institutions have the resources to do high-fidelity simulation.

Simulation has its place – practicing observations, doing a round, listening and literacy of health education.

Simulation hours and the process – used in the programme or in the clinical hours

It's worthwhile, on top of clinical hours in the healthcare settings

Safe area to practice techniques or process or procedures

Takes away risk, fear, anxiety – personal experience

Absence of simulation – adds to the perception the nursing students are not prepared for the clinical environment.

Used to expose others with no health experience to be comfortable with the equipment, tasks, environment.

Time to look at policy and apply into practice

Confidence – to demonstrate proficiency on the precedence.

Working in partnership with RN can be simulated – scenarios and handover techniques and

Communication – collegial relationships

To understand patient or whanau communication

add a new criterion for standard 4 regarding paid clinical placements – to ensure new models of payments are included – why do we want this – benefits – keep students in learning, disadvantaged

with the costs associated with clinical placement – accommodation, child care, Provision of accommodation. Need look at the NSU student survey, should not be the survival of the fit and the wealthy to complete a nursing programme.

**Standard 5** – this is from the student point of view.

5.4 – clinical placement providers or preceptors teaching students activities that are not in their scope of practice – this is a public safety risk

5.9 Recognition of prior learning -

Need nursing council to expand on the RPL standards. – NCNZ to include the ability to transfer institutions without barriers

Evidence from Enrolled nurses – what have the members told us

Can not transfer into programmes with no recognition of previous nursing experience

Issues are – no recognition or all different in the process of RPL and the outcomes for enrolled nurses to progress into Registered Nurse scope of practice.

Silence on the RPL requirements is disadvantaging students.

#### Ask NCNZ re Recognition of prior learning:

- there must be standardisation in the process for enrolled nursing.
- No recognition of Ens who are trained in Australia into RN programme – need to take on the 3-year programme
- If graduated from the same institution a NZ EN graduate is disadvantaged for going into the RN programme

- No recognition of years of practice, workplace learning, validating the EN diploma as a valid qualification that can transfer into the RN programme.
- Examples of areas that are disadvantaging enrolled nurses because nursing council does not specify or engage in proper articulation of RPL standards.

Transferability - no matter the institution you start in there is a process to complete the programme no matter the region a student resides.

Standard 6 - add a new criterion for this standard Page 23 -

Tutors do not like failing students – comments from practice.

New criteria needed to be included: 6.7

Preceptors to able to raise significant concerns about the competency of the students – the preceptors have an issue with the experience of the student

E.g. – unsafe practices – unsupervised medications, unable to write clinical notes, not speaking with patients and whanau – how they speak with patients or not. Taking on tasks that are not appropriate for the environment.

Solution: the institution to undertake revision of the student's competency prior to reengaging with the clinical practice environment. – add into the standard

## Standard 7

It is not just health emergencies that impact upon the ability for students to complete required clinical placement hours and studies (institution).

	Need this standard to widen to all events that could impact upon the ability of the student to complete the clinical learning hours.	
	E.g. – general weather events, earthquakes, lack of roading, flooding, communications – power, internet, transportation – closure of public transport links, closures of certain areas. – AOS police interventions etc. Fire emergencies, strikes (of health care workers that prevents the students attending the area for clinical learning). Ad hoc closures of facilities due to local covid / infectious disease outbreaks (RSV, Noro, VRE etc) – ARC – Thames closed the aged care site.	
	Emergency procedures – need to include civil defence emergency – regional and national emergencies – those appropriated named in the legislation enact the process of instructing communities.
