Education in Region

We have a total of 35 graduates from both cohorts in 2023 which is awesome and of the 32 who successfully sat state only two failed. They will be resitting in March 2024 along with the three other graduates.

For 2024 Semester 1, we currently only have 8 new EN students fully enrolled with 6 applicants yet to complete their side of the enrolment process. We also have two students who have transferred from the BN, and I am hoping that there will be 4 returning students who had to take a break for various reasons. We accept applications into the second week of term so I am hoping there may be more enrolments given the BN Māori programme is not going ahead in July 2024. We will have approx. 46 students across our three cohorts.

In terms of employment for all 2023 graduates, 82% (29/35) have jobs as ENs including two who are continuing their studies in the BN and Midwifery programme here in Tai Tokerau. The EAYL programme made a positive contribution to their 10 candidates' success. Also as far as our tracking is aware only 10% (3) have been employed into Te Whatu Ora services. The other 6 remain unknown at this stage as I still to get in touch with them all. As far as I know only two have left Northland whilst the majority remain. Not a bad track record, I think!

Current Issues in Region

We still struggle to get new members in our area. Current staffing levels remain low in all areas in Northland region. Steady as she goes.

News

We are busily planning for our 1st study day in 2 years. It will be held on Wednesday 20 March 2024 at Northtec. We have given Northtec plenty of Notice this year so that our current students also have the opportunity to attend as well as providing ZOOM facilities for people who are unable to travel. We will also hold our AGM during the study day and will have EN Section registration forms available and support from our committee members to help get these completed.

We are excited and this should be a good day.

(Edited report from) Hayden Erick 5 EN's will be starting in the February 2024 intake. Their placements are in: AED 2x surgical (61 and Totara) Child health (paeds outpatient) District nursing

Recruitment again is a challenge. Managers preferring to employ RN's, unfortunately this shows a bias toward EN's, with managers wanting to process or wait for RN recruitment to be completed before EN's recruitment, which leaves EN's uncertain about employment.

There has however been a significant improvement of ENs from Manukau Institute of Technology (MIT) entering the ACE programme (approx. 25) but unfortunately very little jobs to offer.

The current workforce (new graduate nurses) is looking for RN's which means EN positions maybe converted or overlooked.

For our ENSIPP, we have merged with NETP which means more study days for our EN's and a bigger resource team to draw from. I sit alongside NETP for EN to ensure they are supported, and any study is contextualised for EN. I will collect feedback midway about this.

Currently there are 44 EN's employed at Te Toka Tumai.

EN employment continues to grow with 13 new graduates starting in February 2024, on the ENSIPP, 6 have jobs in primary health and the remaining have placements in: inpatient and community, with a further 2 starting in the May cohort. Some EN's are being employed in areas that haven't had EN's before, so it is exciting times for the EN workforce at Counties Manukau Health.

Manukau Institute of Technology (MIT)

At time of this report, we are awaiting a response from MIT.

<u>Waitemata</u>

Currently there are 37 EN's employed at Waitemata Health, included in the numbers are those at North shore and Waitakere Hospitals.

The EN workforce are working in varied areas of practice; District Nursing, Outpatients, AT and R, Māori Health, Child Health, Theatres, PACU, Medical, Diabetes Services, Bureau, Corrections and Community.

The ENSIP programme that was set up in 2020 with recruitment is still being a challenge due to clinical areas available for EN's to practice.

<u>In Closing</u>

As our new year rolls quickly through February, and as we welcome in our new SoP and Competencies, we can see in some areas, the subtle momentum of a growing EN workforce.

There has been much tireless work going on behind the scenes for a number of years and it's so heartening to see some positive forward motion for all the efforts.

Education in Region

Education in the region has started to pick up. Canterbury Section are planning to have a study day this year.

ENSIPP: 20 EN's started in September 2023 and a further 10 in January 2024, and on the ACE talent Pool two EN's who are both waiting for the right position to come up. There were 43 EN's Graduate from ARA Te Pukenga in July last year so this is a good result from ENSIPP positions.

I am still waiting to hear how many EN's are starting the Diploma in March 2024 and how many are due to finish in July 2024.

Conference 2024 currently we have 9 from Canterbury region registered to attend conference in Hamilton.

Current Issues in Region

EN's are concerned for future careers and the role of the Enrolled Nurses with what is going on regarding the HCA's roles. We have heard that the working group for HCA's is trying to get NCNZ to give them a Scope of Practice, there is also talk around more rumination and another step to be put forward as a claim in the next round of bargaining later this year. They are also wanting a career pathway.

Staffing is still an issue in a lot of areas, this seems to be due to sickness and work-related injuries. with some areas having nursing staff replaced with HCA's as unable to replace with nurses.

Holidays ACT payments, questions are being asked when we will be getting this.

News

Not a lot else to report on at this stage. The Canterbury section would like to take the opportunity to thank the National committee for all the hard work they do. Also, for putting in a submission to NCNZ for the Competency Consultation. The general feedback that we got was very positive overall, but were a few questions raised around how many competencies there were and that the indicators were taken away. Questions were raised around not being sure how to give an example on how to meet some of the competencies.

Otago Polytechnic's New Zealand Diploma in Enrolled Nursing commenced this month with 30 students made up of school leavers and mature students who are returning to study after many years. Two returning students for semester two clinical placements.

Southland Institute of Technology – no update at time of report

<u>News</u>

9 enrolled nurses are in the ENSIPP at Dunedin Hospital, which has just commenced. 2 Enrolled Nurses at Mercy Hospital (private surgical hospital), 1 in aged care facility, I employed in Orthopaedics outpatients and Fracture Clinic – first time they have had an enrolled nurse in Orthopaedics outpatients since early 2000's. 1 in mental health at Wakari Hospital and the rest within Dunedin Hospital.

This brings a total of 18 on the ENSIPP at Dunedin Hospital, as 9 commenced late last year.

16 Enrolled Nurses graduated on the 21st November 2023 at Otago Polytechnic Te Pukenga. Rachael McFarlane was the recipient of the **Enrolled Nurse Section NZNO Award** "**Demonstrating Leadership Skills**".

The enrolled nurse graduates were from a diverse ethnic background, of Pacifica and Asian which was great to see, with one male graduate which was fabulous.

The Southern Region Enrolled Nurse Section Award "Best Overall Student" recipient was Shahla Saleem.

2-3 Enrolled Nurses in Mental Health are being fully funded to do the BN programme at Otago Polytechnic, with bonding of one year back in mental health and funded to do a mental health post graduate paper.

Southland Institute of Technology Te Pūkenga, had their annual awards ceremony for all students at the Civic Theatre in Invercargill on the 28^{th of} November 2023. I attended to present

the National Enrolled Nurse Section Award and Southern Award. The SIT graduation ceremony was held on the 8^{th of} December 2023 in Invercargill, with 13 Enrolled Nurses graduating.

Recipient of the Enrolled Nurse Section NZNO Award "Demonstrating Leadership Skills" was Jennifer McKay.

Recipient of the Southern Region Enrolled Nurse Section Award "Contribution in an Acute Environment" was Paige Hawkins

The Nursing Council of New Zealand visited Te Whatu Ora Southern on the 8th February 2024 and held two sessions at Dunedin Hospital on the RN and EN proposed competencies. Catherine Bryne, Jan Dewar and Jane McGeorge.

Attendance was in person or via teams, with nurses from Southland and Lakes District Hospital attending.

An Enrolled Nurse who attended the morning meeting, contacted me later in the day in regard to having some management competencies in the proposed Enrolled Nurse Competencies as they are a project manager and have a RN under them.

In 2023, the Dunedin Hospital PDRP Co-Ordinator allowed them to do the RN Management competencies for their accomplished portfolio.
