Southern

Education in Region:

Otago Polytechnic had great interest in their mid-year intake and 12 enrolled nurse students commenced the NZ Diploma in Enrolled Nursing on the 2nd of August 2022. The Otago Polytechnic's recent Open Day and marketing push had great results with 57 applications already received for their February 2023 intake of the New Zealand Diploma in Enrolled Nursing - Wow - this is great news Current Issues in Region An Auckland based aged care company have purchased two rest home/ hospital facilities in Dunedin and Mosgiel. All staff were asked to sign new employment contracts. The Enrolled Nurse contract had the following in their contract: "Where the Employee is employed as an established Nurse Assistant (Enrolled Nurse) position the Employee's name must be entered on the Role as a Nurse Assistant (Enrolled nurses who graduated before 2000 keep their previous titles, but enrolled nurses educated after 2000 will have the title Nurse Assistant)". The Registered Nurse who was previously a tutor at Otago Polytechnic was going to bring this to the attention of the management who were visiting from the North Island. Covid- 19 is still having a big impact in the Southern Region, with two wards at Southland Hospital currently closed to visitors. The Covid Ward at Dunedin hospital is continually full and has been given extra support following an urgent meeting with NZNO organiser, as they felt they were not being supported by management. All of our rural trust hospitals have also had covid patients. News Dunedin Hospital have employed quite a few new graduate ENs from Otago Polytechnic and they commence on the 29th of August, in most areas of Dunedin Hospital.

I have been invited to present to them on their first orientation day – the 29th. Enrolled Nurse positions continue to be advertised across the region, Oamaru to Invercargill in Southern Health and private sector. I am presenting to the Enrolled Nurse students at Southland Institute of Technology on the 8th of August along with the Southern Region NZNO Professional Nursing Advisor. Southern Region have had 5 Enrolled Nurses join our regional committee, which will bring our committee up to 12. Southern Region Enrolled Nurse Section are still hoping to have a study day in October, currently looking at venues.

Greater Auckland

Education in Region

The Auckland Enrolled Nurse Section is hosting a study day on the 7th of November at the Ko Awatea Lecture Theatre, Middlemore Hospital.

Planning is now well underway and we are hoping that there will be a good attendance, as many enrolled nurses are requiring educational hours for their PDRP, due to the pandemic.

Manukau Institute of Technology (MIT)

No news to report from MIT.

Te Toka Tumai, Auckland

This is our first section report under the umbrella of Te Whatu Ora, Health NZ.

Auckland Hospital, new initiatives have been implemented:

Twenty six Hospital Supporter workers started in early July and another

cohort started last week. They are buddied with existing team members and receive an orientation and welcome. Recruiting hospital supporters continues.

Winter Task Teams are being deployed from 4 July – 31 October.

Kotahitanga - working together to respond to the greatest need.

There will be three Winter Task Teams to assist in providing safe staffing levels across the organisation. The teams are made up of 4 Clinicians consisting of RN, EN, HCA, AH, AHA's. The task teams will support specific areas with a resource nurse leading each team.

This does not include Child Health or Mental Health at this time.

Task teams will be supporting with things like, acute patient flow; admission and discharge, providing patient care as per smart task boards, assisting with meal breaks, providing well-functioning ward support; for example re-stocking, emptying out linen bags, cleaning bed spaces etc.

At the Greenlane Clinical Centre, RN's, EN's and HCA's are being consistently pooled from our ward to cover dire staff shortages at the Auckland Hospital, which often means we too work on a skeleton crew. It's difficult to capture the turnover of our patients on TREND CARE, so we are constantly on the radar. Staff being pooled, feel the pressure of being pooled from their team and their area of expertise.

North Shore Hospital, they too are in a staff crisis due to large numbers of staff on sick leave and current staff vacancies across the board. With winter incentive payments, staffs are being asked to work additional hours/shifts predominately to cover the gaps on afternoon, nights and weekends.

EN vacancies are being advertised in the hospital and community.

Waitakere Hospital

No update available

Counties Manukau, some wards remain closed until at least

November, as there is simply not enough staff to cover the all the wards at Middlemore Hospital.

Also due to insufficient cover of anaesthetists and anaesthetic techs, there has been a reduction in elective surgery and some of the elective contracts are being done in the private sector.

Enrolled nurses in aged care facilities they are feeling the pinch too with

staffing shortages, lack of good mentorship and communication and cultural differences becoming an issue in some workplaces.

Many concerns have been voiced by staff in residential care that standards of care are hard to maintain, something you wouldn't expect in the 21st century, but here we are.

In Closing

All in all there are problems throughout the whole country and as nurses we continue to be resilient by going the extra mile, picking up extra shifts and coming together as a team to provide the best care for the best outcomes for our patients often in extremely difficult situations.

I must add, that working once again with enrolled nurses on the team, demonstrates that this skill mix works well and I enjoy seeing the next generation thriving, some are moving on to do their RN training and some are simply comfortable in the scope of an EN which is great because they add a balanced flavour to the team.

We wish you all well for productive committee meetings this week and as always, thank you for the tremendous work that you all do behind the scenes.
