The Competencies are shaping up nicely. All going to plan we are hoping that it will all be gazetted ready to be put in place April/May 2024

Greater Auckland and Southern, and Greater Wellington regions have recently held study days and although numbers weren't as high as usual, they still reported back that they were a success. We look forward to hearing about regional Study Days planned for 2024.

Education in Region

Our annual study day was hosted, at Ko Awatea Lecture Theatre, Middlemore Hospital on the 1 st November. Including the committee, we had 46 in attendance, which is down from previous years, however, a number on EN's have retired. As a committee we understand the importance of lifting our section profile to capture the more recently graduated EN's.

Topics presented included, palliative care with information around syringe drivers: the safe use of insulin: delirium in the older adult and information on the Greater Auckland Face Book Page, titled "Online Community".

There were two more presentations by two of our younger committee members who have been in practice for approx. 12 months. Rhiannon presented on her workplace, Turuki Health Care, and the model of health that represents health and wellbeing as a wharenui (meeting house) with four walls, Te Ware Tapa wha. Rickylee's presentation was on chest drains and respiratory. The calibre of their presentations was excellent, and both for the preparation and confident delivery of their individual presentations.

Counties Manukau Health continues to support new graduate EN employment, with 10 new graduates currently on the programme. Currently recruitment is underway for the February and May 2024 cohort of EN graduates. Currently there are approx. 107 EN's employed at Counties. On Wednesday 6th September, Counties Manukau Health held their annual Nursing Awards Ceremony in the Ko Awatea centre at Middlemore Hospital. The day was joined by Key Speaker Dame Valerie Adams who shared her incredibly inspiring story from humbling beginnings, to overcoming much adversity to one day go on to represent New Zealand globally.

The awards saw 126 nominations received for a 12-award category and of those categories being the 'New Graduate of the Year Award' where for the first time since the awards inception was won by Enrolled Nurse graduate, Rickylee Peita.

Rickylee started with Counties Manukau Health in September 2022

where she began her nursing career on Ward 07 - the dedicated Respiratory speciality ward. "I have always had a passion for people and a love for service," the Ex-Flight Attendant reveals, "I never expected to win any award for my service because I see so many of my colleagues do the same thing every day. However, it truly is an honour to be the first Enrolled Nurse to win such an award because it recognises just how integral we are to this workforce and the differences we truly do make to our patients lives."

We would like to congratulate all 12 recipients of the awards and especially like to congratulate Rickylee Peita, the first Enrolled Nurse to receive the New Graduate of the Year 2023 award.

Rather disturbing to hear from a young woman who has started the Enrolled nurse course at Wintec in New Plymouth, that the students are being shown how to do a procedure; IE how to insert a female catheter, and when the lesson is done, they are told not to worry too much as they are ONLY Enrolled nurses so won't be doing these jobs any way!

I believe there is some concern around the tutors and the learning but am awaiting more information.

Enrolled nurses at the DHB are still being rushed off their feet and are doing extra hours, Two more E/N's have retired from Gisborne Hospital, and I believe A few are shortly doing the same In Tauranga.

Southern Region

Education in Region:

Another very successful Southern Region Enrolled Nurse Section Study Day was held at the Southland Hospice on 4th November 2023, with 45 attending across the region. Presentations can be found on the Enrolled Nurses page on NZNO.

Current Issues in Region

Dunedin Hospital is holding a four-hour session for HCAs employed. Notices have gone up, asking HCAs to list what they would like to do in the future!!!

I sent out an email to all our Southern Region Section members for comments on HCA's and received a very poor response back. An EN who worked for the covid response team in the community across the Southern Region last year said she observed HCA doing meds, BSL, and giving insulins, without checking with RN. Also commented that once again EN's not valued.

Another EN, who worked in aged care in a Southern Aged Care facility, also reported to me that HCA's/caregivers were drawing up insulins, not checking vial or amount of insulin with EN/RN and reusing the same needle! The EN subsequently left.

I am concerned that RN's and EN's will let this happen, especially our IQN's, and not aware that they are fully responsible for everything an HCA does. For me, I will continue to nurse/care for my patients without any input from HCA's.

I hope they put the same support of education in for EN's when the new scope and competencies come in at Te Whatu Ora Southern. I have voiced this loudly and will continue to do so. Some EN's in aged care facilities are not getting the support they need, with one new aged care facility CNM, indicating to an EN employed by the CEO, prior to the CNM commencing in the role, that there is no role for an EN here. The CNM had her working as an HCA, and when she consistently asked when she was commencing her role as an EN this is what she was told.

News

Two Enrolled Nurse graduations in November with the first at Otago Polytechnic Te Pūkenga, with 16 graduating on the 21^{st of} November 2023, which I am attending and presenting the Enrolled Nurse Section NZNO Award and the Southern Region Enrolled Nurse Section Award.

An earlier Award ceremony was held in September 2023 for 13 Enrolled Nurses who graduated, and I presented the National Award and Southern Award at the Otago Polytechnic.

Southland Institute of Technology Te Pūkenga, have their annual awards ceremony for all students at the Civic Theatre in Invercargill on the 28^{th of} November 2023. I am attending to present the National Enrolled Nurse Section Award and Southern Award. The SIT graduation ceremony is on the 8^{th of} December 2023 in Invercargill, with 13 Enrolled Nurses graduating.

Numbers are unknown at this stage for EN programmes at Otago and Southland. Otago are waiting for the Foundation Course to finish and think they may get 9-10 applications from this. Hoping for 30 in 2024.

I have been asked to be a portfolio assessor in 2024, and I am looking forward to it. I did do the assessors education via distance learning at SIT, a few years ago, which was NZQA accredited. We have an assessor's day in early 2024.
