Current Issues in Region

The WCDHB is still in the process of undergoing a great change.

The new Hospital build is now well underway with only a few disruptions to everyday life .NZNO and our Management team are still working on the finer points of how the new contracts will look, at present we are all rostered for our own wards but in the future the possibilities for movement around the WCDHB will be covered in our contract. Nursing staff may have to work in Reefton ,Buller or Hokitika with a one day warning that you have to start your shift at 0645 or 1445 or even a night shift and the DHB are under no obligation to pay for accommodation if you are travelling for up to 2 hours each way to get there and back. This we have been informed will not come into effect until the new Hospital has been built but if the Regions are short staffed we will be covering the short fall.

Many of our current Senior staff have voted with their feet and have left already, we are all heartbroken because we have lost some fantastic team members and their incredible wealth of knowledge. They did not make their decision lightly they just don't picture themselves being able to drive up and down the coast road at all hours of the day and night and have moved on to a DHB that offers more stability and will treat them with the respect they deserve.

The outcome of the Enrolled Nurses Focus Day of last July has our Director of Nursing Karen Boustridge and Senior Educator Brittany Jenkins stating that starting in 2017 WCDHB will be taking one new Enrolled Nurse Graduate a year and assisting with ENSIPP. They are currently working with Canterbury DHB on the final document that will provide an appropriate Model of Care and set of goals that will need to be reached in her 6 month period post-graduation. Education in Region:

Another very successful Annual Southern Region Enrolled Nurse Section study day held in Dunedin in October, with 115 Enrolled Nurses attending from Oamaru to Invercargill. Presentations were on the following: Prison Nursing: "Another dimension to Primary Health Care"; Enrolled Nurse Home Haemodialysis, Dunedin; Southern Enrolled Nurse supported into Practice; It's not part of my job: Mental Health Nurses' experience of patient aggression"; Mask-Ed, Pu-Ed and Simulators Down Under; "The Value of Goodbye" Hope and Sons Funeral Directors. Three Enrolled Nurses presented on their area of practice, which were very well received – Enrolled Nurse Home Haemodialysis, Dunedin; Cardiac Rehabilitation & Smoking Cessation Nurse; Respiratory Resource Nurse.

I presented on the Enrolled Nurse Section NZNO just prior to our Annual General Meeting and promoted the 2017 Enrolled Nurse Section NZNO Conference.

The first New Zealand Diploma in Enrolled Nursing education programme at Otago Polytechnic sit their state examination on the 15th November 2016. On the 5th December they have their awards ceremony, followed by graduation ceremony on the 9th December 2016 at the Dunedin Town Hall.

The second programme have been out on their first clinical placements recently.

Southland Polytechnic awards ceremony is on 29th November 2016 at the Civic Theatre in Invercargill.

Another Enrolled Nurse Programme commenced at Southland Polytechnic on the 31st October 2016.

Otago Polytechnic are advertising another programme for January 2017.

The Enrolled Nurses from the Southland programme have got positions in Dunedin Hospital (2); throughout Southland, Christchurch and Australia.

<u>News</u>

Following the AGM at our study day the Southern Region Enrolled Nurse Section Committee now has 14 on it, with two from Invercargill which is great.

We are currently investigating organising a study day in Southland early next year at ? Southland Hospice.

Enrolled Nurse positions continue to be advertised at SDHB and in the private sector (occasionally). Emails are sent out to all Enrolled Nurse Section members informing them of the vacancies and closing dates. I have been getting good feedback in regards to this.

Dunedin Hospital is undergoing a lot of nursing re-structuring with two orthopaedic wards and the neuro/ENT/Eye ward coming together on the 3rd floor with 54 beds. ICU re-build will commence shortly, taking over the whole 5th floor of the hospital and will include HDU units from the 4th and 5th floor as well.

Other re-structures have been Older Peoples Health and ISIS coming together with one CNM and 2-3 ACN's covering 7days.

Dunedin Hospital in crisis mode late September/October with winter illness's hitting late and nursing staff working to the extreme and pressured to open more beds, when not enough staff to man the opened beds. 10 Nurses from Timaru Hospital arrived to assist, but only really needed for one day.

Southern Region Enrolled Nurse Section Membership is 205 following a membership drive and our annual study day.
