Education in Region

The Auckland enrolled nurse section committee have been busy preparing for 39th Enrolled Nurse Section NZNO Conference over the past 10 months and for those attending this year our goal was to bring as many enrolled nurses from throughout New Zealand together, the experienced and the new generation of enrolled nurses so we can share our experiences, impart knowledge, network and simply have fun. We hope you leave this conference inspired and uplifted in order to continually bring quality healthcare and support to patients in your care and together as a national section we all continue to Encompass Diversity.

News

The Auckland Section we able to fund 2 members to attend the Top of the South conference in 2016 from funds generated from the previous year's study day. In total 7 members attended from the Auckland region.

Late last year Auckland Section committee members, Maureen Hansen and Heather Twiss-Penney attended the MIT medal pinning ceremony to present pens and scrolls to newly graduated enrolled nurses and also present the Enrolled Section Award to the enrolled nurse on the programme who had demonstrated leadership skills. MIT tutors selected the enrolled nurse who received this award.

Waitemata District Health Board (WDHB) continue to employ new graduate enrolled nurses and expressions of interest for enrolled nurse employment have been displayed via the intranet. WDHB are again advertising for district nurse positions at Waitakere Hospital. WDHB are now running two enrolled nurse study days per year.

Counties Manukau Health (CMH) continues to employ enrolled nurses.

Auckland District Health Board (ADHB) clinical placements for enrolled nurse students continue.

I continue to represent enrolled nurses on the Professional Development Recognition Programme (PDRP) advisory committee at ADHB and am forever hopeful that ADHB will reconsider their stance on not actively employing enrolled nurses outside of ADHB. The Nursing Council Review of ADHB's PDRP is due October 2017.

Enrolled nurses are now actively involved as preceptors for either student nurses or newly graduated enrolled nurses within all three of Auckland's DHB's, this demonstrates that there are

more opportunities opening up for enrolled nurse employment.

Employment opportunities continue to be advertised in various areas. More recently the Department of Corrections advertised the recruitment of Registered and Enrolled Nurses for Mount Eden Corrective Facility. The opportunity was .7 FTE for EN's with plenty of opportunity of support for funded on-going professional development. Enrolled nurses have been employed.

All in all Enrolled Nurse positions are being advertised more positively throughout the Auckland area with positions at WDHB, CMH, Primary Care and the Mt Eden Correctional Facility. As a section we acknowledge this positively because it is reflective of where we were and where we are heading. As we begin to gain some momentum and move forward we believe we will see employment opportunities in a variety of role unfolding across the different regions throughout our country and we embrace this.

In closing, I would like to say that due to a number of retirements over the past few years the numbers on the Auckland enrolled nurse section committee are dwindling and I would like to challenge our Auckland section members to consider taking up an oar and getting on board with us, we can only be successful in future endeavours if our committee is as robust as it is now. As a committee we thrive on growing personally and being able to make a difference to enrolled nursing and we have made a difference but we would like to continue to do so.

The WCDHB have been very generous to all of its staff providing various Study Days and Half day study days. They have included various subjects like Mental Health Care and Well-being, Stroke and Rehab, Palliative Care and Diabetes.

We are also linked to the Canterbury DHB Online learning site Health Learn which offers various courses including Cardiac, Respiratory and Renal Function courses which can give from 1 to 8 hours of accredited education,

We are also very happy that there is an Enrolled Nurse from the West Coast attending Annual Conference, we are so sorry that it could not be more but as you may all know our families are growing and we all want to be there for them too.

CPIT is also providing 3 day courses on some great subjects and many of us are enrolling in the ones appropriate to our working environment.

Current Issues in Region

The new Healthcare Provision Facility is now well under production and ready for opening early to mid-2018.

The summer months have been incredibly busy, the wards have run at full capacity and more and recently the sick leave has devastated our nursing workforce, the management have started a new employment strategy that all new RN's work a 3 month rotation in Medical and Surgical Wards, to gain experience and confidence in both areas which is a move towards both wards becoming one in the new building.

The two Rest Homes currently operating in Greymouth have recently gone into receivership, which unfortunately has resulted in the closure of Kow-Hai Manor. This Rest Home provided Hospital Level and Rest Home Care to as many as 40 clients. Many staff have had to seek employment elsewhere or leave the coast, the impact on the WCDHB has been patients requiring such care have had to wait in hospital for a bed to become available in another facility. We are all saddened by the closure as Greymouth and the West Coast is in dire need of the adequate provision of care for our elderly residents.

News

We are continuing to promote education opportunities for our Enrolled Nurses and the completion of PDRP's.

Karen Boustridge our Director of Nursing and Brittany Jenkins our Senior Educator held an Enrolled Nurses Forum here on the West Coast in 2015, the object was to strategically plan for the future of the EN and the many rolls they can play in the new model of care that will be provided to the West Coast population when the new Healthcare Delivery Centre is up and running.

One of the strategies that was promoted in the follow up report was the need for forward planning of the EN workforce and that one or two New Graduate EN's would be employed so that the more experienced EN's could preceptor them and pass on their knowledge. It is with sadness that we have recently been told that this programme has been shelved, we are not sure if it is due to lack of funding or a management decision. We are hoping to revisit the strategy in the near future and will continue to push for its implementation.

The WC/TToPENS had a get together at the Recreation Hotel in Greymouth, we were able to provide some platters and enjoyed great food, company and conversation.

Helen o'Connell has decided to step down as the Chair of the WC/TToPENS. We would like to take this opportunity to say thank you for her tireless support and hard work in the promotion of the EN on the Coast.

Two Polytechnics within Southern Region offering the New Zealand Diploma of Enrolled Nursing. Otago Polytechnic and Southland Institute of Technology (SIT).

Otago Polytechnic

Inaugural programme of 12 students, graduated in December 2016. Most have positions, in the DHB – 4 on a medical ward, one in Older Persons Rehab, one new graduate employed at a General Practice in Cromwell; one in Mental Health community programme, one in Mental Health; on in operating theatre; one in aged care sector.

Second programme sit state in July 2017. Third class commenced Jan/Feb and come from a diverse background of nationalities. All those commencing the programme at Otago are in the younger age bracket.

Approximately 21 Enrolled Nurse Positions have been advertised at Dunedin and Southland Hospitals since June 2016. SR Annual General Meeting held at Study day October 2016. We gained 11 new section members at the study day. We currently have 13 on our committee, two of those from Invercargill.

Southern Region Enrolled Nurse Section Study Days:

We are hosting and organising two this year. The first is on Saturday 17th June at the Education Centre, Southland Hospital. This is the first study day for our section in Invercargill. Speakers "Experience of being a patient", by Dr Mark Smith; Enrolled Nurse Home Haemodialysis, Dunedin; Enhanced Recovery After Surgery (ERAS); A Stomal therapist; Palliative Care; New Zealand Diploma in Enrolled Nursing; two surgeons – different topics;

30th September 2017, we are hosting a study day at Dunedin Hospital. Proposed speakers so far are: A Breast Surgeon; A gastroenterologist; An Enrolled Nurse and her diabetes assistance dog "Pip".

We have had our fair share of Enrolled Nurse Retirements within the Southern Region, with 4 Enrolled Nurses retiring from Oamaru Trust Hospital in the latter months of 2016. Two enrolled nurses have been employed there this year.

Southern District Health Board has seen quite a few retirements also at Dunedin and Invercargill. The retiring Enrolled Nurse positions are being advertised and filled by Enrolled Nurses.

Judy Teavae, who received the Enrolled Nurse Section NZNO Honorary membership at the 2016 Conference retired from Dunedin Hospital on the 16th April, following 50years service to the DHB. Judy started as a hospital aide in the Mosgiel Maternity Hospital, then left and worked for Cadbury's for a couple of years. She then got a Hospital Aide position at Parkside Hospital in Dunedin, it was then closed and the staff moved to Wakari Hospital. The hospital aides were

then told they were not qualified enough in the 1980's to look after the patients and they had to either do the Registered Nurse training or Enrolled Nursing training. Judy became an Enrolled Nurse and worked at Wakari Hospital in the elderly long term hospital. But then in the mid 1990's, the hospital board wanted out of long term care and sold the facility off to an aged care provider. Judy was a workplace delegate and was supporting her registered and enrolled nurse and hospital aide colleagues by attending meetings with NZNO, in attempting to keep this open. But they then offered Judy a position as an enrolled nurse on the medical ward at Dunedin Hospital. Some of the RN's and EN's got positions at Wakari hospital and the others EN's and Hospital Aides were made redundant.
