Waitemata District Health Board (WDHB) continue to employ enrolled nurses and new graduate enrolled nurses when vacancies arise.

Counties Manukau Health (CMH) continues to have MIT student enrolled nurse placements with the last batch of students sitting their state exam on the 18th July. However due to CMH overflowing with patients through the winter months employment of nurses is slow but there has been some very positive feedback of enrolled nurse students and some CN's are indicating that they would like to employ them in their workplaces.

Auckland District Health Board (ADHB) I am delighted to confirm the ADHB are currently working on a supported into practice education framework for new graduate enrolled nurses. Two enrolled nurses have been asked to assist with this process, Denise Brandon who works in the District Nursing Service based at Greenlane Clinical Centre and myself. Progress is being made, currently we will be making some planned changes for the direction and delegation for enrolled nurses in the preceptor programme, and we are wanting Registered Nurses to have clarity in their understanding of the Enrolled Nurse Scope of Practice due to the fact that ADHB haven't actively employed EN's for approx. 20 years.

Planning is well underway for Midlands Enrolled Nurse study day to be held on November 18th 2017. The study day title is 'Embracing Opportunities' Enrolled nurses are reporting good education opportunities in their work areas. There have been a enrolled nurses submitting and maintaining portfolios at Proficient and Accomplished level on the PDRP pathway. Enrolled nurses are also working towards completing Waikato DHB online medication management for enrolled nurses. We celebrated National Enrolled Nurse Day on June 30th with presentation of awards to those section members who have contributed and supported regional enrolled nurse activities, we had a good turnout including new section members who joined as we celebrated our day.

As a member of Wintec Employer Engagement Group (EEG) it is great to have a voice on behalf of enrolled nurse students when engaging with our employer stakeholders, including areas of opportunities for clinical placement. We are working with Wintec to write an article for Kai Tiaki on the NZNO and stakeholder partnership, we hope to include an update from the Diploma in Enrolled Nursing and the Tihei Mauri Ora stream. A new enrolled nurse graduate has been employed in a new ward created where patients over the age of 65 years and a variety of medical/surgical conditions can be admitted as they transition from acute admission to discharge home. The ward skill mix was for RN's and HCA's, the graduate EN applied for a position as an HCA however as she had a current APC she was employed as an Enrolled Nurse. Great to see a position in clinic was advertised as an enrolled nurse position after an EN left the area to go back to work in a surgical ward. I think there are going to be lots of exciting opportunities for enrolled nurses and enrolled nurse students in the Waikato in 2017.

<u>News</u>

Canterbury is underway with planning for the 40th annual EN conference. The title ResiliENt and Resourceful was chosen because it pertains to Enrolled nursing and to Canterbury. We are hoping to have confirmation of date and venue very soon.

Deborah and Maree attended Ara to present awards to students. The 2 recipients of the awards were chosen by their tutors. Marco Monaco received the EN National committee award for Leadership Skills. Dawn Whitaker received the Canterbury EN Section award for Excellence in Clinical Placement. All the students present also received a pen and a fridge magnet. The Kim Milward Scholarship for Clinical Excellence was presented to Gemma Holdem by Kim's family. This was the first time this scholarship has been awarded.

Recently the CDHB advertised for an RN/EN for a part time fixed term positon working in Infection Prevention and Control at Burwood Hospital. I am pleased to report that the successful applicant is an Enrolled Nurse!

From Ashburton – EN's from Ashburton attended an EN study day in Timaru, with good reports. Employment opportunities in Ashburton remain static.

From Timaru – Study day in May went really well, with 30 attending from Christchurch, Ashburton, Timaru and Oamaru. Topics included Parinsonian Conditions; Stroke case study; Cardiology; Professional Practice Concerns; Professional supervision; Understanding Delirium, which was excellent as we were given information about what and how to document. We were the sounding boards for a new tool being set up by Dr Stan Smith – a DEMS chart (Delirium Early Monitoring System) which is similar to EWS systems and records scores for delirium, this

tool will give Dr's a tool to glance at to see if the patient is improving or worsening. Our new DON also spoke to us, and things are sounding more positive for EN's in Timaru for the future, we were told that we had a place and they were looking to the future and hoped that this would mean more EN's would be employed, so fingers and toes are crossed.
