The main message from her paper was the message not getting through to RNs on D&D as they don't know/understand their own scope of practice.

It was a Qualitive Research.

34 participated.1/2 RNs and ½ ENs of all different skill levels D&D not happening –communication lacking but allocating is happening, but the RN does not understand the role of the EN .Also the lack of knowledge on D&D.

Update on ACC stance on whether ENs can be treatment providers. ENs should be able to be treatment providers for ACC ACC never intended for ENs to be ACC providers —It is a mistake and an oversight by ACC. In 2003 after HPCA Act came in looked at ENs be included/excluded. Definitions of nurse in HPCA ACT "someone who performs "general nursing functions". NCNZ and MOH have informed ACC that their policies are not in line with MOH policies. MOH will provide ACC information re EN SoP and written advice to help ACC understand the EN SoP. ACC have apparently stated that there may be some work to do around this to make it okay. Suzanne indicated that we will reflect on that. Jill quoted that the legislation would be needed to change the law. Jane indicated that our job is to convince ACC that EN's can provide ACC wound care. Sue G asked about a time frame and Jane responded that this could be an opportunity for the Section to lobby ACC but it looks like it could take quite a while. Jill Clendon — You do a fabulous job and do a great job at lobbying etc. Keep it up.

Nationally there has been a shift in this. NENZ next meeting in December and also DONs meet in a few weeks Outcome going back on the agenda. Northland employing ENs but not new EN graduates Unitec have come off list of providers of the EN education program.

Waiting for latest EN employment data. Kathy, Ara still waiting for data to come in from providers.

Currently there are only 7 providers for Enrolled Nurses There is currently a shortage of experienced mental health nurses.

Need more intakes into the schools of nursing. Jill Clendon - Des Gorman, HWNZ Chairperson, -\$10million contestable fund for new innovations, is on the HWNZ website which outlines the details. Applications open in 2018. An opportunity for EN Section Health workforce development
