Education in Region

Twenty enrolled nurses attended the enrolled nurse study day at Northshore Hospital, in March, with a mix of enrolled nurses from clinics, rehabilitation, orthopaedics, theatre, district nursing services and enrolled nurses from the Wilson Centre.

All in all it was an interactive day with three enrolled nurses presenting.

Two new members joined Auckland Enrolled Nurse Section at the study day.

The Auckland Section is currently in the process of planning the annual study day, which is to be held at the Ko Awatea Lecture Theatre at CMH on the 29th October.

News

In October 2017, Enrolled Nurse Section Chairperson Leonie Metcalfe and Dorothy Browning, Auckland Section Secretary, attended the Manukau Institute of Technology (MIT) medal pinning ceremony. Leonie presented the Enrolled Section Award, last year's recipient was Jacqueline Puru. Pens were also given to all 26 newly graduated enrolled nurses.

Leonie has been in contact with Shelly Scott, Health Centre Manager Auckland Prison. Shelly wrote a piece in the Pánui, December issue. She stated that the Auckland Prison is having a new maximum-security facility built to replace the now 50-year-old building. The new facility, which is due to be completed mid-2018, has created exciting new opportunities for the health team. A purpose-built central health hub and "on unit" health treatment areas will be part of the new facility. In a first for Auckland Prison, the new visitor's centre will have capacity for healthcare awareness training and education to be delivered to friends, family and whānau of the patients in prison. As part of the new build, a review of the health model of care has been undertaken, which has led to new positions becoming available. With the transition from the old to the new facility, three full-time enrolled nurse positions were identified and advertised.

In February Dorothy was invited to discuss her Scope of Practice as and enrolled nurse with new student enrolled nurses at MIT.

Waitamata District Health Board (WDHB)

This year another enrolled nurse has been employed into perioperative services. Adverting for positions for new graduate enrolled nurses continue when vacancies arise.

Auckland Section committee member Mahalah Ensor, who is employed in the Diabetes Clinic at Northshore Hospital, has officially moved over to Diabetes Research two days a week, she is the first enrolled nurse employed in this role. This move has freed up a part time position for another enrolled nurse to be employed in the Diabetes Clinic. There has been significant response to the advertised position.

At the enrolled nurses study day in March, Mahalah presented on her role in the diabetes clinic and she discussed what she did to achieve her Level 4.

Auckland District Health Board (ADHB)

The Enrolled Nurse Supported Transition Framework has now been completed and 2 new enrolled nurses have been employed to work in the Emergency Department at ADHB.

Margaret Dotchin, Chief Nursing Officer at ADHB stated that a number of services are looking at how to incorporate more new graduate enrolled nurses into models of care with the most recent discussions being with the Nurse Director Perioperative. Other Directorates include Adult Medical and Community and Long Term Conditions.

Margaret stated that it is important to ensure that we provide the right practice environment as well as a strong orientation and induction programme for any new enrolled nurses.

Counties Manukau Health (CMH)

In August 2017 a student enrolled nurse doing her last placement prior to sitting the state exam had wonderful feedback from all whom preceptored her. The Charge Nurse was approached to consider employing her. Unfortunately the managers of surgical services are not currently open to employing enrolled nurses. The Charge Nurse, on the recommendation of her staff, then emailed the DoN and HR recommending that this student be interviewed for an enrolled nurse position at CMH. In the interim the student passed her state exam and in September secured a full time job in PACU along with one other enrolled nurse. She gave feedback that a number of newly graduated nurses from her class are now doing the Bachelor of Nursing.

Director of Nursing CMH Denise Keville resigned in February; Denise was very supportive of enrolled nurses in her position as DoN, so we wait eagerly for positive news at CMH. We wish Denise well in her future endeavours.

In closing, thank you Canterbury Section for hosting the 40th Enrolled Nurse Section Conference, many of us know first hand what goes into the planning and organising of such an awesome event. Thank you also to the regional sections for their commitment over the past year, I personally thank the Auckland Section for being such a great bunch to work alongside and finally and as always a big thank you to our national committee and PNA

Suzanne Rolls for your continued commitment to enrolled nursing. You are the oil in the machine that makes it all come together.

Education in Region

Waikato DHB held a study day for enrolled nurses on April 23rd with a great programme with topics including Direction and Delegation, caring for complex patients, diabetes, "Having those difficult conversations", medication management update.

This day was also open to non DHB enrolled nurses. There were approximately 100 who attended including enrolled nurse from Waikato DHB, Aged care facilities, private surgical hospital and a private clinic. Susan Baucke an enrolled nurse who graduated from Wintec in March 2017 is employed by Fertility Associates Hamilton presented an abstract on her clinical practice at Fertility Associates. Susan is certainly well respected in her workplace and has a very diverse role working to her full scope of practice.

Midlands Regional Enrolled Nurse Section have set the date of their study day on November 15th so planning is now underway.

Current Issues In Region

There is still some uncertainty for some enrolled nurses working aged care facilities following the aged care pay equity claim.

News

We have yet to meet up and speak with the new groups of enrolled nurse students at Wintec. Wintec now have two New Zealand Diploma in Enrolled Nursing intakes of students, with a reported increase in employment opportunities. In March members of Midlands Regional Enrolled Nurse Section committee attended the nursing graduation, there were twelve enrolled nurse graduands. We also attended Wintec special awards evening on March 22nd where we presented the National EN Section award for the enrolled nurse student "Demonstrating Leadership Skills" and also presented Midlands Enrolled Nurse Section award to the enrolled nurse student "Best in Clinical Placement". It is always a very proud time as we watch our future enrolled nurse workforce graduate and receive national and regional awards.

We still have lots of work on our agenda.

I continue to work with Waikato DHB Directorate on the Waikato DHB Enrolled Nurse orientation programme as we need to have enrolled nurse graduates well supported as they enter the workforce. This has been a slow process but has a good group working together to make this happen. There have recently been new enrolled nurse graduates employed at Waikato DHB in mental health and in Day of Surgery Admissions and I have heard that there will be a small cohort of enrolled nurses being employed into the Nursing Resource Team soon so this is certainly great progress in employment. However there is still the need to change the mind set of some who are resistant to employing EN's.

I would like to give a big shout out to Midlands Regional Enrolled Nurse Section Committee for the continuing support they give to me and for their great contribution to the committee and Section membership.

My sincere thanks to our PNA Suzanne Rolls and to the National and Regional Enrolled Nurse Section Committees for your commitment, support and for advocating strongly for enrolled nursing at a national and regional level.

Education in Region

It was unfortunate we had to reschedule our planned Study Day in March this year. Our next Study day is planned for 6th September 2018 "Matters of the Heart" and this will include our AGM.

Membership for Greater Wellington is 75 and we have many members with no email addresses so it is a challenge to contact these members, we also have several members with paradise email accounts which have now been closed

Tina Giles reported back from the Advisory Committee for Whitireia.

Whitireia has 2 intakes of 20 students annually. The last cohort of 18 students 9 failed their State Finals the on a second resit 7 passed, so 16 new Enrolled Nurses who all managed to get positions leaving 2 failures.

There is still a stigma between the two training course for the BN's and EN's and this also includes the staff.

The advisory Committee are planning to have all student nurses in white with coloured bands to differentiate the difference with the BN's and EN's. This has come about because the current Student EN's uniform is the same as many Rest Homes so there is potential for confusion if a Student has a placement in the Rest Home.

News

After having conversations with Andrea McCance Director of Nursing for CCDHB she has followed through on her promise by having positions advertised and filled by Enrolled Nurses

New areas for EN being employed in the Eye Outpatient Department, Main Outpatients Department, Pre-assessment, District Nursing, Older Adult Rehabilitation and Mental health.

It is believed that ABI our Traumatic Brain Injury and Rehabilitation Centre are considering taking on Enrolled Nurses.

Education in Region

Otago Polytechnic – approximately 19 enrolled nurse students will sit state finals July 2018 Southland Institute of Technology - 19 enrolled nurse students sat state in March 2018 Otago Polytechnic – Further enrolled nurse programme commenced February 2018 with 19 students

Southland Polytechnic- Further Programme commenced October 2017.

I meet regularly with enrolled nurse students from Otago and students from Southland, when on placements at Wakari Hospital.

Southern Region Enrolled Nurse Section Annual Study Day – Saturday 6th October 2018: Dunedin Hospital.

Presentations are on the following: "Moral Dilemma in Palliative Care"; "Bariatric Surgery"; "a gastroenterology topic"; "Women and heart attacks"; "My role as a plaster nurse"- an enrolled nurse who works in the outpatient department at Southland Hospital. Her roles involves and includes a role as a trained plaster nurse, Wound nurse in our nurse led wound clinics and clinic nurse for orthopaedic/ fracture clinics. She is also involved with the secondary school incubator programme.

Current Issues in Region

National Enrolled Nurse Day 30th June 2018- Southern Region Enrolled Nurse Section is having a display in the foyer of Dunedin Hospital along with enrolled nurse student's posters from their exhibition in March 2018 at Otago Polytechnic. The students designed posters picking a Rehabilitation topic and a Mental Health topic. The groups of four had to present to their peers, explaining their topic.

National Enrolled Nurse Day dinner – a dinner out in Dunedin is planned for all enrolled nurses and students.

News

The best news for staff and patients in Dunedin and the wider Otago / Southland region has been the announcement of a new hospital in Dunedin. This will be built over two blocks and will include a car park, hopefully enough parks for staff included. The present hospital is crumbling with asbestos, water in the operating theatres etc. Planned opening is 2026. Work continues on our new ICU, due to be open later this year.

New Enrolled Nurses continue to be employed at Dunedin and Invercargill Hospitals. Either replacing retiring enrolled nurses or newly created positions. Mental health at Wakari Hospital is occasionally advertising enrolled nurse positions. Student Enrolled Nurses from Otago and Southland have mental health placements at Wakari.

Casual enrolled nurse positions recently advertised at Otago Community Hospice. Presbyterian Support Otago, Ranui Home, Alexandra, recently employed two enrolled nurses, the first for this facility.

A small number of Enrolled Nurses who have qualified at Otago /Southland & ARA Polytechnics and have worked as enrolled nurses at Dunedin and Invercargill Hospitals are now being accepted into the degree programme. Otago are giving enrolled nurses, approximately 50 credits for the first year of the BN programme, (this is the first year clinical).
