Education in Region

We are saddened to see the EAYL program disappear in 2025. This has been a valuable program particularly in Rural NZ where students have to travel upwards of 3+ hours to their nearest Tertiary Institution. It has meant that we have been able to grow our own nurses that already work and live in our community, and they have been able to continue to provide an income for their whanau.

In my practice alone we have had 2 Māori EN grads pass their States and get their APC and another soon to be Māori EN on her last placement with us. When she graduates, she will also work with us in the clinic.

It is sad to hear that our only Polytech North of Auckland may shut its doors on the Diploma of Nursing from next year once the current students graduate. This will be confirmed though in the next couple of weeks when I speak directly to the Northtec Clinical Tutors.

Current Issues in Region

I know we must all sound like a broken record, but nursing shortages and Winter bugs weigh heavily on our ability to provide safe and best practice care for our patients and clients. Te Whatu Ora has not helped this by putting a block on hiring of nurses and in particular I know our local hospital in Kaitia definitely will not employ EN's. Also, with major weather issues totally cutting off some communities from accessing care all together.

We can only look out for each other, support each other and steady as she goes.

News

We would like to welcome Selena Morrith to our Regional Committee. Selena has now taken up the position of Regional Secretary, taking over from Debra Peters. We know that Selena will bring a new positive energy to the Committee and hopefully a few more members as well.

We heard that not many nursing students ENs or RNs were very happy about this year State exams. Even making the newspaper, on how they were all feeling about the questions on the

exam, most students relaying the same information that some of the questions were based on information they were not taught in class or advised to review. Many students were concerned they might not pass their state exams.

I can proudly say of the EN students in the Northland region that sat their States in July, I believe only 1 student will need to resit. So, a great result in the end. We look forward to all of our EN's now getting employment very soon if they have not already had a job offer.

Otago Polytechnic Enrolled Nurse Graduation is on the 13th of September 2024
24 Enrolled Nurses are graduating.

Southland Institute of Technology Awards Ceremony is on Tuesday 3rd December 2024 at the Civic Theatre, Invercargill. Graduation ceremony later in December 2024.

9 Enrolled Nurses working in the following areas of mental health, aged care, private surgical hospital and Dunedin Hospital, graduated from the Dunedin Hospital Enrolled Nurse Supported into Practice Programme on the 14th of August 2024, from the September 2023 intake. They are all being permanently employed.

Current Issues in Region

I am meeting with Jane Wilson, Chief Nursing and Midwifery Officer, Southern to discuss what Enrolled Nurses will be able to do across the region when the new enrolled nurse scope statement and competencies are approved and gazetted by the Nursing Council of New Zealand.

The next September intake of ENSIPP at Dunedin Hospital, has 8 new graduates, including Mental Health and the private surgical, Mercy Hospital. 1 contract pending and 5 applicants unhired- still looking. I presume due to the current non-employment by Health New Zealand this has affected the ENSIPP intake at Dunedin Hospital. Southland Hospital has 3 new Enrolled Nurse graduates joining their ENSIPP.

A quick look on our website and Southern are now back advertising Registered Nurse vacancies across all areas.

News

The annual Southern Region Enrolled Nurse Section Study Day is being held on Saturday 5th October 2024, at the Otago Museum.

This year we are having a theme of “**Celebrating Enrolled Nurses**”.

We have enrolled nurses from a variety of areas – public and private presenting.

Jane Wilson, Chief Nursing and Midwifery Officer, Health New Zealand – Southern Is presenting also.

We are still confirming some other presenters for the day.

Oamaru Trust Hospital is now part of Health New Zealand - Southern. Following the Health reforms of the 80's, all the 5 rural hospitals from Oamaru to Gore became Trust Hospitals and managed by the community. Oamaru has at times had to close their ED at night due to no staff. Hopefully this will now improve.
