Regulation of nursing practice
Protection of public safety by ensuring nurses are competent.

Purpose

Professional and Industrial leadership
Representation for nurses, midwives and health care workers.

Maintain the register of nurses.
Set the scopes of practice.
Set competencies for each scope of practice.
Code of conduct for nurses.
Issue Practising Certificates (competency based).

Standards of practice

Set standards and competencies for speciality area of practice, eg:

- Code of ethics
- Practice guidelines
- Policy development, influence, and advice.

Set standards for education programmes.
Approve programmes leading to registration in a scope of practice.
Set standards for professional development recognition programmes (PDRP).
Approve PDRP programmes
Engage and communicate with nurses and the public on the Council's role.

Provide legal and competence advice and representation.
