

#### **INFORMATION**

Our next symposium is designed as a one day "fly-in fly-out" to save costs on accommodation for those who cannot be away overnight. With a starting time of 9am and with late flights departing Christchurch to all major cities there will be time to enjoy refreshments at the Commodore Hotel Bar prior to departing.

#### **GETTING THERE:**

There is a courtesy bus to and from the Commodore Hotel situated outside Christchurch International Terminal beside the Domestic Terminal, operating 24/7. The Commodore Hotel is situated 2.2km from the airport, at 449 Memorial Ave.



#### WHATS ON:

For those of you fortunate enough to get time off to stay overnight for the Tuesday following the symposium (14<sup>th</sup> November), the New Zealand Trotting Cup meeting is held; New Zealand's equivalent to the Melbourne Cup! This is a great opportunity to get your colleagues together following the symposium to enjoy some team bonding at the races.





Admission to the NZ Trotting Cup ranges from \$20-\$70; and many pubs do pre-booked champagne breakfasts with transport to and from Addington raceway. The first race starts at 11:50, with the NZ Cup at 17:30, not to be missed.

#### ACCOMMODATION:

As this is the beginning of Canterbury Cup and Show week ensure you **book your accommodation** early to avoid disappointment. Many websites offer accommodation with **free cancellation** and no deposit such as WOTIF.COM, so book even if you are unsure of your plans. Cancellations are accepted up to 72 hours before the booking date in most instances.



- Include the background, purpose, method and results (or summary of clinical/ practice issue or innovation) and conclusions.
- The theme of the symposium is "ready steady go" looking at decisions made prior to and during transfer. Your abstract may focus on any topic relevant to the aeromedical field, including research or practice.

## WAIKATO ICU TRANSPORT TEAM



Hello from the mighty Waikato team.

Hope everyone is well and out and about flying in the summer weather as sadly it is starting to come to an end. I know we have!

We had our annual flight nurse study day at the end of last year where it gives us all the opportunity to get together and run through safety procedures and talk about our experiences. We ran a CPR scenario in the BK which certainly gave most of us the opportunity to see how difficult it is in such a confined space – as most of us have never had to resuscitate anyone while flying!

Recently we have said farewell to a couple of members of the team as they go off to other opportunities. This gave the chance for a new member to come on board. I would therefore like to welcome Jane to the team. Jane has worked on the unit for a number of years, so she brings with her a wealth of knowledge. I'm sure she will be another great asset to the team.





We have also recently welcomed the new addition of another MU2 to our vehicles



It can carry two stretcher patients, has a large cargo door, to accommodate the ever growing demand for bariatric transfers, and has a fully automated stretcher system.

The cruise speed is 300 knots, which is slightly faster than our other machine.



This means no more manual lifting and pushing of patients into the aircraft.

Inside the cockpit is a full glass avionics suite which includes an EGPWS – Enhanced Ground Proximity Warning System (technical name for the 'Pull Up,





Pull Up' safety mechanism), TCAS – Traffic Collision Avoidance System.

The pilot displays also have a synthetic vision display (above), which highlights hills to the pilots.

Well that's all from us here in the Waikato.

Fly safe everyone, from Leanne and the Waikato ICU crew.
