

# **Mentoring Nurses**

# to Reduce Acute Hospital Admissions

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### **Background:**

- At the end of 2014, Bishop Selwyn had a total of 31 acute hospital admissions involving 25 residents.
- RNs lack competence & confidence in the assessment and continued service delivery of residents on site.

Infections are not identified early so management and treatment are not started





# Aim: To reduce acute hospital admissions by 25% through:

- Increasing the knowledge and skills of RNs (Advanced Health Assessment) hereby increasing competence in assessment and management of health decline among BS residents
- Control Con





 Increasing the knowledge & skills of Care Givers (CGs) for the early signs & symptoms of resident health decline.

Increasing the awareness & importance of prompt reporting, accurate documentation, to enable prompt assessment & management of declining health.





## **Actions:**

- Control RNs to Postgraduate Health Assessment courses at UO or ARA Subscribe to online education programm
- Subscribe to online education programme of the CDHB (Health Learn)
- **Preceptorship on new RNs / NETP RNs**
- **C** Establishment of RN Champions
- **?** Toolbox education at handovers to CGs





#### Outcome

- A reduction of 60% in acute hospital admission was achieved at the end of 2015.
- Residents are cared for by more competent and confident staff
- **Staff had greater job satisfaction.**
- Very positive feedback from family members.
