

COVID-19 ALERT LEVEL 3



Inpatient Wards - Isolation & Cleaning

Categories below refer to the **Clinical Assessment Tool Level 3**:

COVID CATEGORY	TYPE OF ROOM	PPE / PRECAUTIONS	DISCHARGE CLEANING
'CONFIRMED or PROBABLE COVID-19'	 Negative Pressure Room (NPR) 'Confirmed' can be cohorted (and share bathroom) with other 'confirmed' patients in a multi-bed room 'Probable' <u>must not</u> be cohorted <u>nor</u> share bathroom 	BLACK ISOLATION DOOR SIGN – Enhanced Droplet & Contact • N95/P2 mask, gown, gloves, eye protection • Patient (and parent/caregiver) to wear procedure mask or N95/P2 mask if tolerated	BIOQUELL
'SUSPECTED COVID-19' Symptoms + any epi risk	Negative Pressure Room (NPR)No Cohorts; cannot share a bathroom	BLACK ISOLATION DOOR SIGN – Enhanced Droplet & Contact • As above	BIOQUELL
'COVID-19 EXPOSURE' High epi risk, no symptoms	 AGP* → Negative Pressure Room (NPR) No AGP* → single room (door closed) No Cohorts; cannot share a bathroom 	BLACK ISOLATION DOOR SIGN – Enhanced Droplet & Contact • As above	BIOQUELL
'LOW RISK CONTACT' Low epi risk, no symptoms	 Single, however can be cohorted with other patients - curtains must be closed between patients If having AGP*, see separate AGP guideline Can use a shared bathroom – patient to wear a procedure mask if leaving bed space 	 Standard precautions + procedure mask (patient & staff) for all face-to-face encounters If having AGP*, see separate <u>AGP guideline</u> Patient (and parent/caregiver) to wear procedure mask + maintain 1m physical distancing if leaving bed space Cease precautions 14 days after last exposure/contact 	MANUAL ISOLATION ROOM CLEAN
'VIRAL SYMPTOMS' Symptoms, no epi risk (prior to COVID test result & de-escalation decision)	 Single, however can be cohorted with other 'Viral Symptoms' patients ONLY – curtains must be closed between patients If having AGP*, see separate AGP guideline Can use a shared bathroom – patient to wear a procedure mask if leaving bedspace 	ORANGE ISOLATION DOOR SIGN – Droplet & Contact N95/P2 mask, gown, gloves, eye protection Patient (and parent/caregiver) to wear procedure mask + maintain 2m physical distancing if leaving bed space Review COVID test results & status daily. Refer to Deecscalation Tool for criteria to cease precautions	MANUAL ISOLATION ROOM CLEAN
NOTE – This guideline <u>only</u> refers to inpatient ward isolation & cleaning. Refer to service-specific guidelines for other aspects of management in these patient groups, and in other service areas e.g. theatres, outpatient clinics, allied health, radiology, procedures etc.		* AGP = Aerosol-Generating Procedures (nebulisers; high-flow nasal prongs; Non-Invasive Ventilation; tracheal intubation; bronchoscopy; tracheostomy; invasive upper airway procedures; Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation; spacer administration in an unco-operative infant/child)	

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
