

## NERF Bequests: sample clauses

**These are samples only and it is essential the person interested in making a bequest should obtain his/her own independent legal advice before making any decision about which type of bequest they may wish to make.**

### 1. General Bequest

“I give and bequeath the amount of \$ \_\_\_\_\_ to the New Zealand Nursing Education and Research Foundation Trust Board to be used for charitable purposes as the Trustees of the Trust Board in their discretion think fit. I Declare that the receipt of a Trustee of the Trust Board shall be a sufficient discharge to my Trustee who shall not be obliged to see to the actual application of this bequest”

### 2. A Percentage Bequest

“I give and bequeath \_\_\_\_\_ per cent of the total net value of my estate to the New Zealand Nursing Education and Research Foundation Trust Board to be used for charitable purposes as the Trustees of the Trust Board in their discretion think fit. I Declare that the receipt of a Trustee of the Trust Board shall be a sufficient discharge to my Trustee who shall not be obliged to see to the actual application of this bequest”

### 3. Bequest of Residue

“I give and bequeath the residue of my estate to the New Zealand Nursing Education and Research Foundation Trust Board to be used for charitable purposes as the Trustees of the Trust Board in their discretion think fit. I Declare that the receipt of a Trustee of the Trust Board shall be a sufficient discharge to my Trustee who shall not be obliged to see to the actual application of this bequest”

### 4. Specific Purpose Bequest

“I give and bequeath to the New Zealand Nursing Education and Research Foundation Trust Board the sum of \$ \_\_\_\_\_ to be used for the following purpose/project/programme \_\_\_\_\_. Should this purpose/project/programme no longer be required or needed, then the bequest may be used for such other charitable purposes as the Trustees of the Trust Board in their discretion direct. I Declare that the receipt of a Trustee of the Trust Board shall be a sufficient discharge to my Trustee who shall not be obliged to see to the actual application of this”
