2) How the scholarship has contributed my own professional development.

The scholarship has kept me from worrying about the extra incurred financial costs during the first phase of my PhD study with Victoria University of Wellington. The first phase of my PhD study is about reading and thinking abstractly and conceptualising a deeper intellectual question. Reading and thinking abstractly enhance my professional development by expanding my knowledge as I examine and critique existing literature related to my topic of interest.

3) How the scholarship has contributed to nursing As an undergraduate nurse lecturer for the Bachelor of Nursing Pacific in Whitireia, I plan, deliver and evaluate teaching sessions for 1) Applied Bio Nursing and 2) Pacific Health Access to Health Care and Traditional Healing to Level 6 of the Bachelor of Nursing Pacific. These papers are related to my topic of research interest and therefore, a continuous literature review that I do with my PhD nursing study provides richness to delivering quality teaching for undergraduate nursing students that are based on current literature and evidence based practice.
