



Te Wāhanga Rangahau Tapuhi Nursing Research Section (NRS) Grant Guidelines

Thank you for your interest in applying for a Te Wāhanga Rangahau Tapuhi Nursing Research Section (NRS) Grant. Please read the following guidelines before applying:

1. You must be a current member of the NRS, NZNO to be eligible.
2. Grants may be made to assist members of the NRS to attend/ participate in events related to nursing research that will further their knowledge base of the field they are working:
 - workshops
 - seminars
 - conferences
 - post-graduate study and
 - study days
 - publications etc.
3. Applications are required to be submitted on the [NRS Grant Application](#). These forms are available through the NZNO Scholarships and Grants site www.nzno.org.nz/support/scholarships_and_grants, and should be forwarded to research@nzno.org.nz.
4. Grants made will be subject to the availability of funds.
5. Grants up to a total of \$1,000 may be awarded per application round.
6. It is expected that NRS, NZNO is acknowledged in some form of output resulting from the grant.
7. Written reports
 - i. There is an expectation that the knowledge gained should be shared.
 - ii. A report (approx. 500 words) is required within six working weeks of completing the research activity for publication in places such as NRS website and the NRS newsletter.
 - iii. Your report should outline how the grant helped towards your professional development, practice improvement/s from the recommendations of your research, and/ or changes to nursing practice.
 - iv. Please ensure the report is sent in a Word document to the above email address.
 - v. In absence of a report being filed, the section request that the grant money is returned.
8. Grant money must be used within six months of being awarded.

In deciding the amount granted, Te Wāhanga Rangahau Tapuhi NRS committee will take into consideration the total amount requested, and contributions from the employer or other funders.

Individuals may receive a maximum of one grant every two-years. For example, if awarded a grant in February 2026, the next application considered for that individual will be from February 2028.
