Tausi Soifua Samoa March - August Activities



Talofa lava, malo le soifua. This brief report outlines the main activities the Tausi Soifua Samoa (TSS) members were engaged in since the last newsletter. Despite work and family obligations, the members' commitment to the association was obvious in their coming together to achieve some of the activities highlighted here.

Siloma Masina's Scholarships

Scholarships at a value of \$1,500 were established in honor of Siloma's contribution to the Pacific Nursing in New Zealand particularly her work with the Tausi Soifua Samoa. On March 24th, scholarships were granted to three third-year nursing students from the Pacific Nursing Program at Whitireia.





The 3 successful recipients pictured here are, Faasala Tuigamala, Keromesa Kome and Limoe Kelly. Siloma's daughter Alexa presented the awards on behalf of the Tausi Soifua Samoa Association and the Wellington Branch members. We wish the students all the best in their studies.

Nafa o Tausiga - Samoa Nursing Philosphy of Caring Workshops

The implementation of the *Nafa o Tausiga - Samoa Nursing Philosophy of Caring* Workshops was the key focus of the TSS activities in the past four months. The key purpose of the workshops is to increase members' knowledge and understanding of the concepts and principles of the Tofa Manino o le Tausiga – Samoan Philosophy of Caring and the applications when caring for Samoan patient/client and families.

Our very own Samoan senior nurses, Galumalemana Togia'i Vaifagaloa Naseri and Tai'ivao Siniva Cruickshank, were the key presenters. Three workshops were carried out in Auckland, Wellington and Hamilton in the months of June and July. Galumalemana and Tai'ivao have been providing cultural trainings for TAHA Tapuaki.

Overall, over 60 participants including the TSS members and non-members attended the three workshops. The target audience was mainly Samoan nurses and student nurses, however the workshops attracted other Samoan health workers such as social workers, a Samoan podiatrist, radio/media personnel including non-Samoans. Participants found the workshops productive and rewarding. The information further their understanding and knowledge about their identity as

Samoans and how the principles of the Nafa-o-Tausiga can be incorporated into nursing practice.

Excerpts from participants' feedback and reviews include the following:

'This [workshop] has extended and enhanced my understanding of the Samoan culture'

'I have realised how important it is to be reminded about our own philosophy of caring so we don't get absorbed in the medical model philosophy that we are practicing...'

'These workshops should be done more often'

Train-the-trainer approach was also incorporated in the workshops to form part of the TSS association and workforce



sustainability plan. Despite the short time allocated for preparation and planning, the workshops were executed successfully. A great faamalo to everyone! Another workshop on the *Nafa o Tausiga - Samoa Nursing Philosphy of Caring* will be the main focus of the **TSS**
