Conference Call for Abstracts: Open Beginning of February 2020

Introducing Biography of;

Bronwyn Taylor, Nurse Consultant Perioperative Services, Auckland District Health Board.

Bron graduated with a Bachelor of Nursing from Wellington Polytechnic in 1995 and has worked for Auckland DHB since then. She worked in the Adult and Emergency ORs at Auckland City Hospital for over 20 years. Initially trained to work in vascular and transplant, she was the Charge Nurse Floor Coordinator from 2003 - 2015. As such she organised the day to day running of the OR department (13 ORs including acute rooms) in conjunction with the other Charge Nurses and coordinators. She was responsible for organising the acute workload for each day, liaising with the surgeons and teams regarding availability and patient acuity. In 2015 she completed a 16 month secondment coordinating the set-up and operationalisation of the hybrid OR. During this time she worked closely with the teams from vascular, cardiac, cardiology and interventional radiology who all have scheduled lists in the room. In September 2016 she was employed by the Radiology Department as the Interventional Radiology Coordinator, ensuring effective co-ordination of all multi-disciplinary clinical activities on a day-to-day basis. In August that year she was seconded to the Radiology Charge Nurse role to cover for parental leave. In this role she was responsible for managing the RN workforce over three sites. She has been the Nurse Consultant Perioperative Services, Auckland DHB since April 2018 providing nursing leadership for quality and safety.

Bron has a keen interest in further education. She has completed a Post Graduate Diploma in Health Sciences, focused on leading and managing change and is currently undertaking Masters level research at the University of Auckland, School of Nursing. She has had articles published in The Dissector in 2006 (34:1) and 2017 (45:1). She is also the New Zealand representative of the organising committee for the Australasian Definitive Perioperative Nurses Trauma Course (DPNTC), and has directed and taught on the New Zealand course annually since its introduction in 2004.
