



LONG-ACTING REVERSIBLE CONTRACEPTION TRAIN-THE-TRAINER WORKSHOPS

THE AIM OF THIS INITIATIVE IS TO INCREASE WORKFORCE CAPABILITY IN PRIMARY CARE AND IMPROVE ACCESS TO LARCS.

The New Zealand College of Sexual and Reproductive Health (NZCSRH) and The Royal New Zealand College of General Practitioners are working together to provide long-acting reversible contraceptive (LARC) training support.

LARC Train the Trainer courses

NZCSRH are providing LARC 'Train the trainer' courses for health practitioners who are **already competent in LARC procedures**, as per the [Long-Acting Reversible Contraception: Health Practitioner Training Principles and Standards](#), and **who want to train others**.

Funding is available for a number of health practitioners to attend the course for free. This includes:

- All midwives
- All community-based nurses
- Any health practitioner from approximately 300 high-needs practices identified by Te Whatu Ora
- Any health practitioner from a rural practice – those defined as R1, R2 or R3 on the [Rural-urban classification for NZ health research and policy](#).
