

Our New Chair Person Denise Braid

I began my career as an Enrolled Nurse at Oamaru Hospital. I worked across all specialities mainly in maternity which almost lead me to start my midwifery training. In the late 1980's I moved to Christchurch Women's Hospital as an Nurse, Enrolled working the Gynaecology/Gynaecology Oncology Ward. This cemented my association with women's health. I worked there for 3 years and during that time I worked overseas for a year. In early 1990's I had time away from nursing helping care for my brothers children. As an Enrolled Nurse with 14 years' experience I had always said if there was a shortened course to bridge to a Registered Nurse I would do it. Wellington Polytech called my bluff and started offering a 2 year bridging programme. In July 1992 I began the bridging programme with a diverse group of Enrolled Nurse's from around the country. I was inspired to look at what possibilities this new qualification would open up for me. Fate seemed to keep sending me back to Women's Health in my clinical placements, firstly Gynaecology Theatre and then to the Gynaecology Ward. On completion of the course I flirted with the idea of

working as a practice nurse but was enticed back to the staff nurse role in the Gynaecology Ward. In 1995 I begun working in Women's Clinics; Gynaecology, Colposcopy assessment Clinics. I am still there today as the Charge Nurse Manager. During my time in Wellington I was looking for gynaecology specific conferences and education sessions to attend with my colleagues. I was a founding member of a group of nurses from around the country in the New Zealand Gynaecology Nurses Interest Group (NZGIG) I was part of the group transitioned NZGIG who to the Women's Health Section of NZNO. I have always been interested in what was happening in the section and have attended all but 2 conferences. I was asked to come back on the committee at the last conference and look forward to WHS becoming a College in the New Year.
