Criteria and supporting information

The Women's Health College of NZNO is pleased to offer a small education fund available to college members. The funding is to assist members with study, training days, courses or conferences that will expand the member's knowledge and positively enhance the care of their patients/clients, family and whanau.

- \$5,000 per annum allocated to the education fund.
- \$400 per person is the maximum contribution.
- A college member can only apply every 3 years.
- Applications must be received prior to committee meetings, by 1 February, 1 July and
 1 November each year.
- The money goes to the person who applied and cannot be transferred to another person in an organisation.
- All recipients of funding must provide the committee with a report about their programme/course when completed.



To obtain funding for conferences or any other education, complete the application form and send in for approval. Once you have attended your conference/education send your receipt and a short article to the Women's Health College and you will receive your funding.
